Directions: Read each task and the criteria for all four projects. Select one project to complete for your nonfiction summer reading novel and one project to complete for your fiction summer reading novel. Circle or highlight your two choices below.

Task #1-Dear Abby

Imagine that you are allowed to give one character some advice or words of wisdom. Write a letter to one of the characters that offers them some wise advice that can help them in the novel. Be sure to use specific evidence from the novel as support.

Task #3-Word Cloud Collage

Create a Word Cloud Collage of words, phrases, and sentences from the novel that describes the novel to someone who has never read it. You may select to cover the entire novel or focus on a single element (character, setting, theme, etc.)

Task #2-Morning Announcements

Imagine that your school is trying to encourage reading by promoting a different book each morning during announcements. You have been selected to write an announcement for the novel you just read. Create a 30 second advertisement that will describe the novel and the reasons why other students at your school should read the novel.

Task #4-Trading Places

Imagine that you wake up one morning and have become the main character in the novel. What would you do differently in the novel? Use textual evidence to explain why you would change things or keep them the same.
